When I Write By Hand, a poem by Maria Teutsch

I asked Maria to give me lyrics to score a section of the audio drama "Waking Up," where the main character is transported to a fabricated (by a brain chip) memory from childhood. When describing her resultant poem, she mentioned that she'd recently noticed how her mother's penmanship began showing up in her writing.

The music begins by asking the performer to share a few qualities they've inherited from their parents. It can be as trivial as the way you walk, or little expressions you grunt when you get up, or perhaps larger things like addictive behavior, certain climates of mood, etc. Please speak the manner you would if you were sharing this information with a friend at a party. Dynamics should be converational. Begin your answer with one word, then a one-sentence explanation of your answer -- perhaps how you first noticed it, or what you think of this inheritance.

After answering, sing the note as written. Wide, changing vibrato. Mesa di voce in very long breaths. Dynamics and length ad lib. Try to not complete note at same moment as other performers. Once complete, repeat exercise and describe another quality you inherited.

Boxed sections in measures 21 through 30 are rhythmical in nature, tempo should be roughly adhered to with most sections asking performers to stagger their repetitions. Note in measure 30, all staves are in a single box, meaning performers should sing synchronised.
